FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



Some of the Jewish people in first-century Palestine were expecting God to send them a Messiah who would raise an army and lead them

in battle against their enemies. The hope was that God's spirit would work through the Messiah to establish God's reign on earth, a reign filled with peace and justice.

In today's Gospel, Matthew says that God's Spirit to send it like a dove

and hovered over Jesus as he came out of the Jordan River after John baptized him. In this way, Matthew identifies Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah through whom the Spirit of God would work in a special way. With Jesus's baptism, God begins the process of establishing his reign on earth, a process that continues even today.

Matthew's description of the heavens opening and the spirit descending on Jesus suggests that he is thinking of the prayer we find in Isaiah 63: 7-19, a prayer composed during a low point in Jewish history – the Temple in Jerusalem was in ruins and the Jewish people were living in exile. Utterly defeated, the people turned to God, begging God to intervene in their world. The prayer ends with the plea for God to open the heavens and once again visit his people. Matthew purposely uses similar terminology, saying the heavens opened and God's Spirit descended upon Jesus, because he thinks God answered this prayer at Jesus' baptism. God was once again visiting the people.

Scriptures scholars suggest that the image of the Holy Spirit as a dove may come from the second verse and the first chapter of Genesis, where we read that a mighty wind swept over the waters of the earth at the beginning of creation. The Hebrew word for "wind" can also mean "Spirit of God." So we understand that this verse to mean the Spirit of God hovered over the earth before God began forming the world into an inhabitable planet. By using this imagery in today's Gospel, the evangelist implies that the same creative Spirit will be active in Jesus, recreating the world into the reign of God through him.

The Spirit of God continues establishing God's reign of peace and justice in our world today. What are



we doing to help? How can the Spirit of God work through us to promote peace in our world, in our communities and in our homes? How can we be the Spirits' instrument of justice for those who are poor and oppressed?

Like many of you, I have been following the debate surrounding gun control. My belief is an anything that we can do to help suppress the proliferation of guns in our community and to decrease the level of gun violence is a good thing. Many of us have seen personally the effects

of gun violence here in our Oakland neighborhoods. As many of you know, I work with the Oakland police and fire departments, and in particular with the Ceasefire Operation and Crimestoppers of Oakland. All of these have heightened my awareness of the violence that exists in our neighborhoods. What I detest in this dialogue is the fear-mongering that is being displayed by elements of the political right. My hope is that we can all come to a common agreement that gun violence is out-of-hand in this country, and we all have to work together to seek a decrease in the shootings.

I have enclosed a letter from Carol Johnson, the Director of St. Mary's Center in Oakland. St. Mary's works with homeless senior citizens in North, West and Downtown Oakland. With monies that were initially set aside for the Mother of Peace Orphanage, it was decided that we should redirect those funds to local causes, since we could not be assured that monies sent to the orphanage would be securely received by responsible parties in Africa.

Next week we begin our Black History Month celebrations with our commemoration of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. I understand that Harry Santi and Leonard Pete will be part of this event next week.

Also, at 7:00 PM next Sunday the 17, St. Benedict has been invited by Bishop Bob Jackson to attend a Dr. King celebration at Acts Full Gospel Church here in East Oakland. Please feel free to join us and to connect with joyful hearts to other Oakland congregations!
