FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



Some groups have secret handshakes to distinguish members from nonmembers and other groups have emblems or distinctive uniforms. The followers of Jesus also have something to set them apart from the crowd Dash their love for each other. Today's gospel reading and with Jesus tell me

the apostles that their love for one another will be the way of the people know that they are his disciples. Love is supposed to be what separates them from those who do not believe in Jesus.

A problem arises because the English language uses the one word, love, to describe a variety of experiences. We sometimes think of love as a feeling, but we can also use this word to describe many different types of relationships (e.g. the relationship between a parent and child, the relationship between two friends, or the relationship between a husband and wife). This little four letter word can have several different definitions depending on the context within which we use it. With so many possible meanings, how can we know for certain what she's had in mind when he spoke the words in today's Gospel?

Although Jesus did not speak English, he may have known three different languages: Hebrew (the official language of the Jewish people); Aramaic (the everyday language of the people of Palestine); and Greek (the language of the Roman Empire). Of the three languages, Greek will be the most helpful in determining the type of love of Jesus was talking about because it is the language of the New Testament.

There are several different Greek words for our one word "love", including philia, a love that describes the relationship between two friends; eros, sexual love; and agape, a self-giving love. Of the three different word for love, agape is the one we most frequently find on the lips of Jesus. It's also the word for love in today's Gospel.

Agape is a love that focuses on the needs of the other person. It is freely given without counting the cost and without thinking of getting anything in return. Agape looks beyond physical beauty, color of skin, political beliefs, and status. It means reaching out to all people even if they are repulsive or society considers them worthless. It is a love that should be the hallmark of every Christian.

"See how they love each other!" Was the way the non-Christians describe the early followers of Jesus. Would not Christians today say that about our parish community here at St. Benedict?

I want to remind folks about the recent release of a new Mobile App for St. Benedict parish. This app is available for download in the Android and Apple Stores. The App is a new and effective way for our St. Benedict family to communicate with you and for you to stay connected with the parish. The App is PACKED with prayer resources including Liturgy of the Hours, Daily Mass Readings, the Order of the Mass, Sunday Reading Reflections, the Bible, the Catechism, African American Catholic resources and website links, a digital rosary and on and on. It is also packed with educational resources, parish events, event sign up forms, liturgy schedules, photo capture tools, discussion boards and more. Best of all, we can alert you of extra special happenings and cancellations via the app's push notifications system. You can download the app in the following ways: Search for it in the app store; use the flyers we are making available in the bulletin; look for the app link in the bulletin insert. We will have people available after Mass to help you download the app. This is in addition to the renewed parish website and our occasional Constant Contact email newsletter blast that we send out.

Please don't forget about our Ceasefire Walk this Friday evening at 6:30 PM here at St. Benedict. There will be a potluck gathering at 5:00 PM in the parish hall, with folks coming to the church around 6:00 PM for prayer and instructions.
