TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



When there is a large dinner banquet, the seating arrangement usually reflects the status of the invited guests. The place of honor is always at the main table with the most important guests sitting next to the host. It was no different in Jesus' day.

In today's Gospel, Jesus warns audience not to assume that they deserve the coveted places of honor, because of someone more important arrives late the host may ask them to make room for that person. The resulting embarrassment will be great indeed if the only space left is in the lowliest spot.

The Jews often used a banquet as an image of the reign of God. Many of the Pharisees with whom Jesus sat at table believed they deserved the place of honor in God's reign not only because they were good Jews but also because of their strict observance of the Jewish laws. Jesus warned them against making this assumption.

In the story Jesus used to illustrate his point, the dignitary who came late and displaced the other man symbolized a sinner. Since many Jews believe sickness resulted from sin, people such as the lame, the blind, and lepers would've been in this category. The displaced guest symbolized the Pharisees who thought they were holier than others.

Jesus' audience would not have missed the point of his message. Jesus was telling the Pharisees they better not be too smug because the people whom they considered sinners might actually be holier and deserving of more honor in God's reign. Pride cannot only blind us to our own shortcomings but can also make us overlook the good in others.

A woman dreamt that when she died and went to heaven, she was surprised to see some people whom she considered spiritually inferior. Then she noticed that each of these people also looked surprised because, it seems, none of them expected to see her there either. Pray this week that God will teach us how to be humble.

I'm writing this from St. Augustine by-the-Sea Parish in Waikiki, Honolulu, Hawai'i, visiting family and friends, but doing some work as well. We welcome back Fr. Sylvestre from his vacation back home in Nigeria. He will be with us throughout the year as he completes his internship, after having received his Masters degree in counseling from Saint Mary's College

in Moraga. Fr. Sylvestre was previously in residence at St. Lawrence O'Toole parish here in Oakland. Welcome again, Fr. Sylvestre!

Many of us continue to monitor the situation in Baton Rouge, as many of your family and friends have been deeply affected by the flooding. Others have harkened back to the events of Hurricane Katrina and the levee breaches in New Orleans. As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, if there is anything that we as a parish can do to assist those affected, particularly your loved ones, please let us know.

A recent New York Times article titled "Affluent and Black, and Still Trapped by Segregation", addresses a broad yet little explored aspect of American segregation: Affluent African American families, freed from the restrictions of low income, often end up living in poor and segregated communities anyway. The article continues to note that it is a national phenomenon which challenges the popular assumption that segregation is more about class than race, that when black families earn more money, some ideal of post-racial integration will eventually be reached. An article definitely worth a read.

Another article worth noting is a recent report by the Oakland Police Department and the disparity in car stops by OPD. The article, found in the last Tuesday's East Bay Times, details the inequality that takes place regarding the percentage of African-Americans living in Oakland versus the number of African-Americans stopped in cars and as pedestrians. African-Americans were more likely to be stopped and searched by OPD as well, the report concludes.
