FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



The Jewish judicial system was different from our own because it did not have judges. In each city or town, the residents chose elders to serve on the town council which not only passed the laws but also tried and punish those who broke them. The Jews called the men who served on this important body elders because they were older men respected by the towns people for their wisdom and intelligence.

Elders also settled civil disputes between two or more Jews. When neighbors disagreed on property boundaries, people had difficulty paying a debt, or business partners disputed the meaning of the terms of their contract, they brought their disagreements before a panel of three elders who usually listen to both sides of the case while sitting in the town square. Because of human nature and the possibility of bribes, Jewish law did not permit a lone elder to decide a case.

The parable of today's gospel is about a woman who went to a judge to demand justice. Since there is only one judge in the story and because Jesus does not describe him as an elder, the woman probably brought her case not to the Jewish town council but to a Roman court.

Roman judges were notoriously corrupt and they often ruled in favor of the party who was most powerful and important or who gave the biggest bribe. So if she was poor and insignificant, there wasn't much chance the widow would win her case. However, when she did not give up but persisted and demanded justice, the judge eventually ruled in her favor so she would stop pestering him.

Just as the features of a champion bodybuilder are more pronounced when he stands next to 120 pound person, the mercy and justice of our God is more apparent when we compare it to the judge and today's Gospel. We can always count on our God to treat us as we deserve and that we should not give up when God does not respond to our prayers as quickly as we would like. Instead, we have to be as persistent as the poor widow. That's the lesson of this parable.

Sometimes when we ask a friend or a family member for something, their response is not always what we expected. Is it possible that God has already answered our prayers but we're not aware of it because God answered those prayers in a totally unexpected way?

As you may remember, back in the spring many of us gathered to begin a pastoral planning process to determine the vision and direction that St. Benedict parishioners would like to see over the next five to six years. Led by Chuck Siebenand, formerly the Director of Pastoral Planning for the Diocese of Oakland and Pastoral Associate at St.

Columba parish under Fr. Paul Vassar, the process enabled us to determine a number of goals and objectives that will help guide the parish over the next few years.

As part of this process, we have been planning for a reconfiguration of the current St. Benedict Parish Council. Many parishes within the diocese are adopting a Pastoral Council format, where this body is charged with implementing the Parish Pastoral Plan. Such a group would also be selected by a process of discernment rather than an election, which is a change from previous years.

This process of discernment involves parishioners nominating other parishioners who they feel could be excellent candidates for serving on a Parish Pastoral Council. Such skills as the ability to listen, to dream and have vision, to compromise and build consensus, to be prophetic, to be rooted in their faith in Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit, would be characteristics that we would be looking for as valuable to membership.

Over the next three weeks, we will be soliciting nominations for this Parish Pastoral Council. You are invited to submit a name of a parishioner (or yourself) you believe would make a fine Pastoral Council member. There will be 3x5 index cards in the pews over the next few weekends so that folks would be able to place names in nomination. There will be a box in the rear of the church so that you can place those names.

Nominees will receive a letter and/or a phone call inviting them to two discernment meetings (Monday, November 14th and Monday, November 21st, both at 7:00 PM), where they can decide, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit and prayerful discernment, whether they want to serve St. Benedict parish in this capacity.

My hope is to have this new St. Benedict Pastoral Council in place by the beginning of the new year, and to place the implementation of the Pastoral Plan into their hands.

I know that this is a change, but I am convinced that we need to go in this direction in order to survive as a parish. We need to make it clear to ourselves and the Diocese of Oakland that we have a viable plan for the future of St. Benedict. Parishes and schools within our East Oakland Deanery are facing some very difficult decisions surrounding viability, and I want to secure the future of St. Benedict parish by proper pastoral planning.

Just a reminder that from this Thursday, October 20th to Saturday, October 29th, I will be serving as a Spiritual Director to the Diocese of Oakland's Year of Mercy Pilgrimage to Italy. Coordinated by our own Camille Tompkins, who works for The Catholic Voice, we will be visiting sacred sites throughout Italy, beginning with Venice and ending in Rome. A number of parishioners will be on

this pilgrimage as well, including Fr. Paul Vassar. Fr. Sylvestre will be presiding at the weekend liturgies in the absence of Fr. Vassar and myself. Please keep us in your prayers.
