FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



Fasting can sometimes be a prayer for God's help when making a difficult decision. It indicates the individual wants God's help so much that the person is even willing to suffer for it. Fasting in Jesus' day meant not eating anything from sunrise until sunset. Because one could take food after sundown, a person would not starve during a long fast like the one Jesus endured in today's Gospel.

We can assume Jesus' fast was a form of prayer for guidance from God. Up until that time, Jesus had spent all of his life as an obscure carpenter in a small town but was contemplating making a radical change by giving up the family business and becoming a wandering preacher. "What will my friends think and how will I support my mother? Will anyone even listen to me?" All these thoughts must have been on Jesus' mind so he brought his concerns in prayer and fasting to his God.

Jesus' fast lasted forty days, a biblical number symbolic of transition or change (e.g., forty days and forty nights of rain in Noah's day, forty years of wandering in the desert before the Jews entered the Promised Land, etc.). After praying and fasting, the will of God was clear to him and Jesus knew he had to give up the quiet and secure life of a small town carpenter and take the risk of becoming a traveling preacher.

Docetism, a heresy in the early Church, said Jesus only pretended to be human, his life being an act or charade. The Catholic Church always rejected this way of thinking and has always taught that Jesus is both God and human. This means Jesus experienced all the fears, all the anxieties, and even all the temptations other human beings experience. Today's Gospel reading tells us that even Jesus had to pray for guidance.

Is there anything we would be willing to fast for? Would it be for something we would not directly benefit from (i.e., world peace, healing for a sick friend, a relative's marriage, or the recovery of a neighbor who is addicted)?

Lent is the Church's annual, built-in "retreat time". Lent is a time where we confront those things that separate us from God and each other. The goal and question we ask when all is said and done after the Lenten Season is complete is, "What has changed in my life so that I have been brought closer to Christ?"

As we begin Lent, we're invited to do three things - PRAYER, FASTING and ALMSGIVING. Prayer - to hear God more clearly. Fasting - to empty our

desires and to connect with those in need. Almsgiving - thanking God for what we have and to help others less fortunate.

Thank you to all of you who helped make our Black History Month a memorable occasion. A particular word of gratitude to Dionne Cola, Leonard Pete and Arianna Catherine for their work in making it all possible!

Thank you for your patience during my absence from the parish these past few weeks. Serving as the chaplain for the FBI Academy was a rewarding and enriching experience, connecting me to folks from around the world. Working with the intelligence community is always an eye-opening and interesting experience. I'll probably do that once more later this calendar year. Will keep you updated. Much blessings to all of you in this Lenten Season!

LENTEN SCHEDULE:

Stations of the Cross

Every Friday during Lent we will gather to walk and pray the Stations of the Cross in the church at 12 noon. All parishioners are welcome.

Days of Abstinence:

All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat and meat products for everyone who is fourteen years of age and older. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence (one full meal, two lesser meals, no meat, no eating between meals) to all persons who are between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine.

HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE:

Holy Thursday – April 13th at 6:30 pm followed by potluck

Lent ends with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. The Lent has six Sundays. The sixth is Passion or Palm Sunday and marks the beginning of Holy Week.

I encourage all who make use of this dispensation to engage in another sacrificial or charitable act that day.
