I, Father Sylvester Odurinde, a priest of the Catholic Diocese of Oyo, Western Nigeria, and also a Marriage and Family Therapist and Professional Clinical Counselor, sincerely express my profound gratitude to the Pastor of St. Benedict Parish, Rev. Jayson Landeza, for given me the opportunity of residency while I was looking for where to stay for one year internship programs, I also thank you all the loving community of this church for your love and gestures toward me. I am indeed grateful. Your impact remain an indelible mark on my life. I will never forget you in my prayers, for all your kindness and gestures and love.

Dear People of God, I am indeed eager to go back home by the end of May 2017 to work as a Marriage Counselor/Counselor among my people who are less than 55,000 Catholic out of a 2 million population; a community that is primarily Muslim and Baptist.

It is my mission to provide all the professional help I can to assist and ensure the unity of families in my country. To be able to do this I am humbly asking you for your financial help. Upon return to my country I have to set up an office for myself and a sanctuary in which to meet those families I will provide counseling for. I need supplies, computers and internet services.

In the course of my internship I have written two books which are based on experiences I have had, both clinical and in advocacy, during my stay in the USA. The books are entitled "Understanding Early Childhood Mental Health" and "Crisis Response in Our School". The book entitled "Crisis Response in Our School" is dedicated to Rev. Jayson Landeza for all his support during my one year Internship Programs. This book is also dedicated to the loving families of St. Benedict Parish for your love, support and gestures toward me.

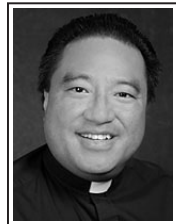

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



Two of Jesus' disciples are walking down a road when a stranger approaches them and engages them in a conversation. Later, the disciples managed to persuade the stranger to join them at dinner. During the meal the stranger take bread, blesses it, and gives it to them. Suddenly they realize the stranger is Jesus.

Throughout the history of Christianity, the breaking of the bread has been the most important sign of belief in Jesus. Despite great personal risk (being a Christian in the first century was illegal and was an offense punishable by death), The early Christians gathered at someone's house before sunrise on the first day of the week to share a meal that included fruits, nuts, cheeses, bread, and wine. In the course of this meal, they read from scripture and recalled some of the things Jesus said and did but the most important action occurred when they took the bread, blessed it, and shared it with each other just as Jesus did with his apostles on the night before he died.

The breaking of the bread soon became a sign of the unity and fellowship of those who followed Jesus. Just as many grains of wheat are used to make flour and many grapes are needed to make wine, many different individuals come together to form the Christian community. So sharing of the one loaf and drinking from the same cup became a visible expression of Christian unity.

Historically, Christians have always been united as they should be. Disagreements over doctrine or discipline have led to splinter groups in factions that compete for converts and donations. In many ways, the unity expressed in the breaking of the bread is not a present day reality, but it is something we must continually strive for.

Does unity mean all Christians must think and act the same? Is it possible for different denominations to be united in their faith in Jesus and still disagree with each other? Pray this week that Christians will have the patience, understanding, and mutual respect needed to make unity a reality.

As I mentioned in all the liturgies over the past weekend, I am deeply grateful and thankful for all the work that people did in order to make our Easter celebrations a wonderfully joyful occasion. I'd like to thank Leonard Pete and the choir for all their work throughout the year but particularly through the three days of the Triduum and Easter Sunday. Long hours of rehearsal and leaving us in faith filled worship is the blessed task of this wonderful group of people. Thank you again Leonard and choir. I am also grateful for the work of the liturgical environment committee, who is ministry is to reflect the liturgical seasonal changes that the church asks us to display during these time. Under the direction of Betty Kennedy Tapscott, her crew makes sure that the church's liturgical environment is both beautiful and dignified, and they have done just that! Thanks as well to Ofelia Wanzo for her work in putting up the banners. Thanks as well to the lectors, under the coordination of Jo Soublet. The Triduum invited parishioners to listen intently to the rendering of various Passion accounts and numerous readings at the Easter Vigil, and that burden falls on our lectors - that you again! Wallita Sykes-Bush takes care of our ushers, and I am grateful for their ministry now and all year round.
