FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



In today's Gospel, Peter, James, and John witness something very strange when they climb to the top of the mountain with Jesus. Without warning, Chito's clothing becomes dazzlingly white, while both Moses and Elijah appear and talk to him. Voice comes from a cloud that

overshadows the group. Within seconds, the vision ends.

This vision is rich in symbolism. Moses symbolizes the Jewish laws, while Elijah represents the prophets. Together, they stand for The Law and The Prophets, another name for Jewish Scriptures. The purpose of the Scriptures is to prepare of the world for the Messiah will conquer the world and have the rule of the world over to God. With God in control, there will be no more pain or suffering or death. The Jews call this the reign or the kingdom of God.

The cloud overshadowing Jesus and his visitors whatever reminded the apostles of a column of clouds God used to lead the Jewish people out of Egypt. So the cloud is symbolic of God's presence.

The symbolism in the remainder of the reading also deals with the reign of God. The Jews pictured the saints wearing bright white clothing in God's kingdom, which is exactly how Jesus is dressed.

Peter offers to erect three tents (or booths). Because the Jews lived in tents when they were in the desert on their way to the Promised Land, tents were a symbol of God saving power. Some Jews believed that everyone will live in tents in the reign of God.

This symbolism about the reign of God is very important because it points to Jesus being the Messiah even though he will not live up to the popular expectations. Instead of being the victorious military leaders some Jews were waiting for, Jesus was to die the cruel and painful death of a common criminal. By everyone's standards of that day, Jesus was a failure.

In today's Gospel, it is clear the apostles do not grasp the meaning of what Jesus is telling them because as they come down from the mountain we find them discussing what Jesus meant when he said he would rise from the dead. They, too, were looking for a victorious political/ military Messiah who would not die. If the apostles had difficulty understanding what Jesus was telling them, it's understandable that today's religious leaders would have difficulty discerning God's will for the Church. Pray that the Holy Spirit will give wisdom to religious leaders so they can discern God's will for God's people.

I am writing this bulletin article the morning after our Annual National Night Out (NNO) here at St. Benedict. We had a wonderful turnout amidst an absolutely perfect day weather wise. Great music, dancing, food and information tables. I am grateful to so many people who made it happen: Linda Palmeri, Reese Fernandes, Tara Sykes, Janey Outley, Ofelia Wanzo, Earline Gilbert, Jorge Watson and Elaine Lemay, Leonard Pete and the choir, Jackie Stewart and the Friday line dancing class, and all those who staffed the tables. Thank you for another successful National Night Out!

In my hopes of keeping you informed about my comings and goings, I will be away from the parish from Monday, August

7th to Friday, August 25. I have to be at a funeral in Honolulu on Tuesday, August 8, a 50th wedding anniversary on Sunday, August 13, a vigil and a funeral on August 14 and 15, all in Honolulu. I will remain at St. Augustine by-the-Sea parish on Waikiki Beach in Honolulu until Friday August 25, spending time with my sisters and brothers and other family located on O'ahu, as well

as helping out in the parish.

I received a phone call from Father Ken Hamilton, SVD and he informed me that fellow SVD priest, Fr. Aris Martin, is relocating to the East Bay and has been accepted into the doctoral program at the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley. Fr. Ken asked if we had room here at St. Benedict to take Fr. Aris as he begins and completes his studies. I met with Fr. Aris and find him to be a very friendly and intelligent person whose presence will be an asset here. Fr. Aris will be joining us on August 15th. Fr. Vassar will continue his active ministry in our parish.
