FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



The Jews had every reason to be proud that they were God's chosen people. After all, they were God's instruments and God was working through them in a special way. But because of this pride, some Jews looked down at other people as being inferior and sometimes they even refer to Gentiles as

dogs.

Some Jewish leaders thought their special relationship with God entitled them to certain honors and privileges. They believe the Messiah (also known as the Son of David because he was supposed to be a descendent of King David) would come only for the Jewish people. Through him, God would lead them in battle, defeat their enemies, and establish his reign on earth. As a Jew, Jesus was familiar with this belief.

In today's Gospel reading, a Canaanite woman calls Jesus the Son of David. Although she is not Jewish, she acknowledges Jesus as the Messiah because she wants him to heal her daughter.

At first, Jesus doesn't reply to the woman. Later, he explained to her that he, the Messiah, is supposed to go to just those who belonged to the house of Israel (the Jews). The woman persists but Jesus doesn't give in. He replied that he cannot throw the food of the children (the Jews) to the dogs (the Gentiles), echoing the popular belief that the Messiah is just for the Jews.

The Canaanite woman is stubborn and she reminds Jesus that even the dogs get what the children don't want. The suggestion is clear. If the Jewish leaders won't except him as the Messiah, then maybe Jesus should turn to the Gentiles. Historically, that's exactly what happened.

In the Acts of the Apostles and in St. Paul's epistles, we find that the apostles first preach to the Jews but then turn to the Gentiles when fewer Jews than expected put their faith in Jesus. Like the woman in today's Gospel, many Gentiles accepted Jesus and, as a result, Christianity spread throughout the world.

Carefully read today's Gospel. What reason does Jesus give for granting the woman's request? Pray this week that we will become more like the Canaanite woman.

As I am writing this, I am enjoying my vacation at St. Augustine by-the-Sea Catholic Church on the shores of Waikiki Beach in Honolulu, Hawaii. I admit that I have been spending time at work, albeit not at the same level as back in Oakland, but working nonetheless. Funerals and vigils/wakes, as well as parish obligations such as presiding at Mass and hearing confessions have kept me busy, alongside numerous family obligations and visits.

Like many of you, I have been keeping keenly abreast of the tragedy that took place in Charlottesville, Virginia last Saturday, but more particularly attuned to Trump's

sad and pathetic response not only to the incident, but to race relations in general. Like many, I have long been concerned about his mental fitness and suitability for office, and although I am not surprised to see these events and his reactions unfold in this manner, I am actually frightened by the power he holds and those who continue to support him.

I respect the OFFICE of the Presidency, but I have never liked nor respected the current occupant. Long before he was a candidate for the presidency, I have considered him a media joke, a loud mouth charlatan and a racist. Words can't begin to describe my sheer anger over his attempts to discredit President Obama's Hawaii both records, regarding them and the format of those records as fake. Birth records from the same state as my parents, calling into question the validity of the Hawaii Department of Health records. I am still stunned that anyone voted for this pathetic person, and even more shocked that he became president. I am sickened by him and the racist "dog whistles" that come from his mouth and the measly responses that come from his lackeys.

I am deeply encouraged by how the faith community in Charlottesville responded to last week's events. I am hoping that as East Bay faith leaders, we can rise up and resist these forces of evil when they come to protest in the Bay Area.

Our very own Dr. Chiquita Tuttle was a candidate for the City of Oakland's Police Review Commission. Although she was not selected, Chiquita found the experience to be enlightening and informative. Thank you Chiquita for stepping up to the plate and for your willingness to serve.

Parishioners Leonard Pete and Tara Sykes will be representing St. Benedict at a national youth training conference in San Antonio, Texas. The parish has been provided funding by Lifeteen, a national Catholic youth program. I am hoping that they will return with great information to help us begin something here.
